# EYFS – Hints and Tips for Parents Physical Development



With the warmer weather and lighter evenings now here, why not take advantage of the numerous parks we have in Luton? Activities you can do with your children:

- Throwing a Frisbee
- Kicking and throwing a ball
- Counting the number of pushes when on a swing
- Using the monkey bars (good for developing upper body strength. This helps with their writing too!)
- Using climbing frames encourage your child to climb by themselves. How high can they go?
- Running races great for getting their heart rate up (and yours too)!
- Climbing and descending steps with alternate feet
