EYFS – Hints and Tips for Parents

Listening Skills

You can start by raising children's awareness of the sounds around them to develop their listening skills. E.g. When going for a walk try drumming your fingers on different items outside and comparing the sounds.

You can develop children's awareness of sounds made by various instruments and noise makers e.g. pots and pans in the house.

When reading a story encourage your child to make sounds e.g. a sheep baaing.

Ask your child to make loud and quiet sounds.

You can help by developing children's awareness of sounds and rhythms. By singing songs and action rhymes listening to music and developing a sounds vocabulary.

To develop children's appreciation and experiences of rhythm and rhyme in speech read rhyming stories, play rhyming bingo and clap out the syllables in words and play odd one out games.

If you need help or further advice please speak to your child's key worker or one of our senior staff.

Please allow your child to walk up the stairs to reduce the risk of you dropping them, and to develop their physical skills and independence. Thank you
