Vitamin-D Supplementation

The recommendation for vitamin-D supplementation are changing. The new recommendations state the following amounts per day:

- 10 mcg per day for pregnant and breastfeeding mothers
- 8.5 mcg per day from birth to 1 year
- 10mcg per day for 1 year +

Please Note: Failure to pay your child's fees may result in their place being offered to someone else.


