


Dear Parents.

We hope you have found time to visit your child's new school and meet with the teaching staff. Or perhaps you have been to some play and stay sessions which can really be helpful.

We have been busy filling in transition paperwork for your children and also spending time talking to the school staff about your children and their needs, which we hope makes the transition much easier for them and you.

Flying start are offering - Let's Get Ready for School - A three-week virtual Zoom programme for children due to start school in September 2021. Each session will last 30 minutes and there will be one session per week.

Luton Council, who operate Flying Start, are providing help and information – look out for 'Getting Ready for School' which is open soon.

Our staff members have recently undergone further training for this coming term and those which follow. 'CONTEST' being the topic, the national training requirement for all staff, following an anti-terrorism strategy, opposing radicalisation. Again, intended to Safeguard all children attending, of all ages — as well as their parents.

From the start of our new term, we will be using the brand new Early Years Foundation Stage (EYFS) Profile/Curriculum for learning and teaching, agreed by H.M. Government very recently. In the next month, we will be publishing our nursery fees for 2021 to 2022. It is expected a small increase will be applied, as there has been no increase over the last year.

It's time to roll up your sleeves and get vaccinated!

If you're aged 18 or over and a Luton resident, you can walk in for your Covid-19 vaccination: No appointment or ID is needed, other than proof that you do live in Luton. It can be your first dose, or a second dose if it has been at least eight weeks since your first vaccination. It would be helpful if you can provide your NHS number if you have it, but this is not essential. Also, if it's your second vaccine bringing your vaccination card with you will speed up the process. Staff will also be on site to answer any queries you may have about the vaccines. Pharmacies across the town, including Boots at The Mall, have received fresh vaccine supplies so many of them are now in a position to offer additional appointments for a jab – either a first dose or the all-important second one. Anyone over 18 can book their vaccine atwww.nhs.uk/covid-vaccination or by calling 119. Please tell anyone and everyone you are in contact with – family, friends, neighbours, people you know through community groups, places of worship or any other activity and play your part to protect our local communities. Button batteries







Button batteries, particularly big, powerful lithium coin cell batteries, can badly hurt or kill a small child within two hours, if they get stuck in the food pipe. Know where yours are, so you can keep your children safe.

Five top tips

- Look round your home for lithium coin cell batteries in products as well as spare and 'flat' batteries.
- Keep products well out of children's reach if the battery
- Store spare button batteries in sealed containers in a high
- Remember that 'flat' or 'dead' batteries still hold enough pow to badly hurt a child. So put them out of children's reach straight away and recycle them safely and as quickly as possible
- If you think your child has swallowed a button battery, don't delay, take them to A&E straight away or call 999 for an ambulance. Don't let them eat or drink and don't make them sick.
